## Minor Differences

Answer: ARMY HELMET
There are two sets of prompts; the left side are all cryptic clues, and the right are normal. With some smart searching, one can determine that the answers to both sides are all the names of minor planets as designated by the International Astronomical Union. The clues are numbered so that the complete answer set is in alphabetical order, and each planet on the left has a paired planet on the right that is an anagram plus an additional letter.

As clued by the second part of the title, finding the differences in ID numbers for each pair yields the ID number for another minor planet.

This process reduces the 24 original minor planets to 12 , and this can be done once more with the new minor planets; the pairs are now anagrams with two extra letters in one member.

The 12 minor planets have been reduced to 6 , and can be again to 4 by repeating the process. The anagrams now have three additional letters. In this special case, 1485 Isa is used three times as the shorter-named member of a pair.

Repeat the operation one final time to reduce these 4 to 2 ; pairs have four letters different.

At last, we come to the boxes at the bottom; 879 Ricarda and 23 Thalia match the lengths we need. Multiplying these ID numbers gives us 20217 Kathyclemmer, which fits the boxes on the other side of the equation. Extracting the letters in the given order yields our final answer, and some protection from the flying amusement ride parts: an ARMY HELMET.

## Author's Notes

Nick: This puzzle originally had all-cryptic clues, which didn't quite work. Then we tried changing over to all-trivia clues, which didn't quite work either. But using one set for the shorter names and one set for the longer ones seems to have hit the sweet spot. At one point we planned to mention "three Independent Spin Axes" in the flavortext as a hint that ISA had to be used three times, but eventually decided it wasn't necessary.
