

Day-jà Vu Adam Maresca

The modified bingo cards' contents, unique in all 300 cells, all contain various plants, creatures, minerals, agricultural products and tools vital to pre-industrial society. The "players" listed atop each all have some seasonal connotations, such as weather or temperature or plant life. Combined with Calendar Man and the titular French pun, the French Revolutionary Calendar is the key to this one, in particular its Rural Calendar, in which every item on the cards is the object of celebration on a specific day in some month.

Every "player" corresponds to a month in that calendar; select the things celebrated in that month on their card, and disregard the others. Highlight/mark these on the cards.
